Six valid Absentee Ballots were received after the election and before noon on this day of canvass. These ballots were counted during the canvass and are included in the foregoing election counts. Four invalid Absentee Ballots were received and not counted and included in this canvass. There are eight mail-in Absentee Ballots outstanding. These ballots were not received and therefore not counted and included in this canvass.

Candidate **Dana Williams** received the highest vote total for the office of Mayor. Candidates **Jim Hier** and **Kay Calvert** received the highest vote totals for the two City Council seats. The newly elected Mayor and City Council members are scheduled to be sworn and seated on January 3, 2002 or soon thereafter, and will serve a term of four years.

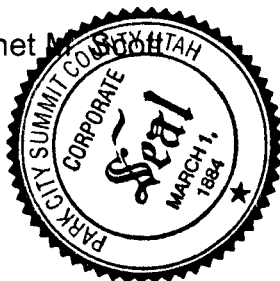
